It's official! Forest Oaks Park will be expanding! In February we accepted ownership of an additional 22 acres and new lake bordering the East side of the park. In the near future we will be starting new trails, fishing docks and a pavilion or two. Hope you are ready for some **LONGER** walks in the park! The cable fence has been taken down and we still need to add a couple entrances, but feel free to step across the ditch and walk around the new area.

It's lifeguard hiring season again too. We have a lot of returning lifeguards, but always have spots for new ones too. If you are returning **OR** new, please get your applications in **ASAP** so we can start planning our certification classes.

New park parking lot! The new park parking lot is almost completed and will open soon. The new parking area is lighted and will provide an additional 21 parking spots to pull cars off the street during busy events and times.

**FLOOD CONTROL!!** We are continuing to work with Harris County Flood Control, the Army Corps of Engineers and the Department of Transportation to mitigate flooding inside Harris County WCID110. On page 6 of this newsletter is some more detailed information. There will be more information coming as projects and issues are being worked out and put on schedule. Keep an eye on the District website and social media pages where information is posted as it arrives.

Lastly, **RECYCLE TRASH!** If you are not doing recycle, **YOU SHOULD BE!** We have recycle containers in the office and stickers for your larger recycle cans. ## HC 110 FLOOD MITIGATION UPDATE

February 2020

**GOOD NEWS!** Your HC 110 Directors and Langford Engineers are diligently working to reduce flooding within HC 110. HC 110 has adopted a two-prong approach: (1) steps that can be taken **now** to immediately reduce the risk of flooding; and (2) steps to facilitate long-term projects for additional flood abatement infrastructure. Your Directors have committed funds and have authorized HC 110 to partner with the Harris County Flood Control District ("HCFCD"), the United States Corp of Engineers ("USACE"), and the Texas Department of Transportation ("TxDOT)" on various projects.

**Detention Pond** - HC 110 and HCFCD are partnering to excavate, enlarge, and improve the current detention pond located behind the Fred Haas dealerships, which will provide additional volume to facilitate drainage and mitigate flooding. Construction is expected to begin later this year. **Enchanted Stream** - HC 110 is currently working with CenterPoint to relocate the utilities along Enchanted Stream just south of Cypresswood. It is anticipated that, after the utilities have been relocated, HC 110 will partner with HCFCD on a project which will improve drainage.

**I-45 at Cypress Creek** - Upon invitation from your HC 110 Directors, HCFCD Executive Deputy Director Matt Zeve attended HC 110 meetings on July 31 and August 28, 2019, to provide information, answer questions, and generally respond to residents' flooding concerns. Since that time, additional information, drone footage, and photos have been provided by Langford Engineering to HCFCD. **Progress is being made.** At a public meeting held December 17, 2019, TxDOT and HCFCD confirmed that the I-45 southbound frontage road bridge at Cypress Creek is scheduled for replacement in June 2021. This is excellent news! However, your HC 110 Directors and District Consultants have not stopped. Communications and meetings with HCFCD continue, most recently on Monday, February 2. HCFCD personnel have also met with Langford Engineering at the I-45 / Cypress Creek bridge for visual inspections. HCFCD and TxDOT are continuing to study the I-45/Cypress Creek bridge area and we hope to have more news to report in the near future.

**USACE** - In July 2019, four (4) Letters of Intent were provided to USACE by which HC 110 requested that the USACE conduct an investigation to determine an effective flood reduction project which could be completed within the boundaries of HC 110, and pledged up to \$200,000 to match funds provided by USACE. At this time, HC 110 is still awaiting a response from the USACE.

**Other Projects** - Several other flood mitigation projects are currently under construction or have been recently completed which will reduce flooding within the boundaries of HC 110. Although HC 110 was not involved in the projects, your Directors want to provide accurate information regarding the current projects. **Seals Gulley** - HCFCD approved a channelization project for Seals Gulley and work has begun. The project begins on the south side of Cypresswood Drive and proceeds downstream approximately 1900 feet, and includes reconstruction of the side slopes and replacement of most of the back-slope drains. Both east and west sides of the Gulley will be repaired. **Hardy Toll Road at Cypress Creek** - Harris County Toll Road Authority completed channelization work on both sides of Cypress Creek underneath the Hardy Toll Road. The project included hard edge treatment on lower sections of the stream banks, new storm drain outfalls, and removal of sediment on both sides of Cypress Creek. The improvements have lowered the low-level flows about two (2) feet. **Cypress Creek** - HCFCD issued a maintenance contract for erosion and channelization repairs of the Cypress Creek main channel from the west side of Hardy Toll Road upstream approximately 4,000 feet. This project includes hard edge treatment on lower sections of stream banks, replacement of storm drain outfalls, correcting flowline issues, and removal of sedimentation on both side of Cypress Creek. Construction began in September 2019 and is anticipated to be complete end of 2020.

## Recycling & Refuse of Texas

### Guidelines for Pickup

- **ONLY USE CLEAR BAGS or RECYCLING CONTAINERS.** Items in black or white trash bags will not be picked up
- Have items out by 7AM
- Place recycling on opposite side of driveway from trash
- If you move, please leave the recycling container at the home



*Reuse*

*Reduce*

*Recycle*

- **Paper** - magazines, newspapers, copy paper, phone books, junk mail, etc.
- **Plastic #1 through #7 (NO Styrofoam)**- juice, water, milk, soda, detergent, cleaners, RX bottles. (If in doubt, check bottom of container for recycling emblem and number in center)
- **Aluminum** - any type of soda beer or drink can, etc. **(PLEASE RINSE OUT)**
- **Tin Cans** - any food can, pet food can, etc. (no aerosol containers) **(PLEASE RINSE OUT)**
- **Cardboard** - boxes, cereal, food, detergent, pet food, etc. (No grease stained boxes or containers with food)
- **Glass** - any color glass. Must be pure glass. Cannot be ceramic, mirror, pottery stoneware, or china type items.
- **Thin Plastics** - bags from grocery, sleeve on newspaper, wrapping on dry cleaning - **bags MUST be tied together and put into another bag. NO LOOSE BAGS.**



Effective with this month's bill, the North Harris County Regional Water Authority (NHCRWA) Fee is increasing from \$4.55 per 1,000 gallons to \$4.92 per 1,000 gallons. This Subsidence District mandated fee, reflected as a separate line item on your water bill, is paid directly to the NHCRWA and is used to design, build and operate existing and new infrastructure, which delivers surface water to your district.

**Harris County Project Recovery** is aware that many homeowners were not able to wait for federal funds to be allocated to make their homes safe and livable. Many homeowners depleted critical personal funds to make these repairs, repairs that would have been eligible for federal disaster relief funds if the funds had been available. This program will reimburse eligible expenses paid out by homeowners in Harris County to repair homes damaged in Hurricane Harvey. Recycling is not a new concept. As early as the 1600's bronze scrap and other precious metals were collected and "recycled" for perpetual reuse. Dust and ash in Britain from wood and coal fires were used as material in brick making.

Curbside recycling of newspaper first began in Berkley, California in 1973, and shortly after, New Jersey became the first state to mandate recycling.

Recycling has become a major industry in the United States, employing thousands of workers and saving energy, reducing land fill demand, and conserving valuable resources. Residential Recycling of Texas is proud to be part of this industry.

Residential Recycling of Texas is a strong believer in a cleaner environment for the future of our communities.

### Why Recycle?

- Conserves natural resources
  - Trees
  - Ores – Metals
  - Oil
  - Natural Gas
  - Water
  - Land lost to mining and drilling
- Conserves Energy
- Reduces air pollution and green house gas emissions
- Saves landfill space
- Saves money
- Creates jobs

### Some interesting facts about landfills:

- A landfill can take up to 10 years just to plan it
- Cost of constructing the landfill can top \$30 million
- Annual operating cost of a landfill can be greater than \$5 million
- The landfill may only last 50 years
- Landfills emit noxious gas
- Toxic waste from landfill enters our ground water and ultimately adjacent waterways
- Once a landfill is closed the cost nor contamination does not stop there

### Recycling Tidbits

- The United States represents 4.25% of the world's population, yet we consume 24% of the WORLD's natural resources
- About 80% of what Americans throw away is recyclable
- Recycling creates six (6) times as many jobs as landfilling
- It generally takes less energy to make products from recycled materials versus virgin materials
- Everything that goes into a landfill stays there taking up space. As waste breaks down – which can take hundreds of years – it releases methane gas into our air and toxic pollutants into our water table
- Americans total yearly waste would fill a convoy of garbage trucks long enough to wrap around the earth six (6) times and reach halfway to the moon.

### Paper Facts

- 1 ton of paper saves the following resources:
  - 17 trees
  - Enough fuel to run the average car 1,260 miles
  - Enough power for the average home for 6 months
  - Saves 3.2 cubic yards of landfill space
  - Eliminates 60 pounds of air pollution
- The US Postal service delivers more than 87 billion pieces of direct mail (advertising and promotional or "junk" mail) every year
- If we recycled all the newspaper printed in the US on a typical Sunday, we would save 550,000 trees – that's 26 million trees per year
- Newspaper can take 5 years to completely decompose in a landfill

### Steel / Aluminum Facts

- Recycling just one aluminum can saves enough energy to operate a TV or computer for 3 hours
- Recycling one pound of steel conserves enough energy to light a 60-watt bulb for 26 hours
  - 1 pound of steel = 7 cat food cans or 4 dog food cans

### Glass Facts

- One ton of glass recycled saves the following resources
  - 1,330 pounds of sand
  - 433 pounds of soda ash
  - 433 pounds of limestone
  - 151 pounds of feldspar
- Recycling one glass bottle saves enough energy to light a 100-watt bulb 4 hours

### Plastic Facts

- A plastic bag takes 20 years to decompose
- A plastic cup takes 250 years to decompose
- Recycling 1 ton of plastic milk jugs save enough energy to light a home for approximately 1 year
  - 10,000 plastic jugs = 1 Ton
- Americans use 2.5 million plastic bottles every hour

## **Adult Swim:**

We will open the pool for Adult Swim beginning on April 7th. Adult Swim times are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9am-3pm. **During Adult Swim, no children under the age of 18 are allowed inside the pool area.** Only FOSRC members 18 years or older and their paid adult guests are allowed to be inside the pool area and use the pool.

## **All Ages Swim:**

The pool will be open regular hours to all ages beginning on Tuesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>. This means all babies, toddlers, children, teenagers, adults, parents, grandparents, and even great grandparents are welcome to come to the pool! We will have our lifeguards monitoring the pool during these hours to keep everyone as safe as possible. Regular summer hours are...

**Tuesday-Saturday:** 11am - 9pm

**Sunday:** 12pm - 6pm

**Monday:** Closed

## **Pool Rules Reminders:**

All children under the age of 12 are required to take a swim test to be in the water by themselves. If a child fails to swim 25m (one way down the pool), then a parent or guardian must be in the water with the child at all times and no more than 10 feet away.

Parents **MUST** be inside the gated pool area if they are with children under the age of 14. Children under the age of 14 are not to be left at the pool by themselves.

Individual water wing floaties are not allowed. Flotation aids for novice swimmers must be Coast Guard Approved lifejackets or puddle jumpers (chest piece in front). The lifeguards will have loaner ones if needed.

Any type of pool loungers, large inner tubes, or large boogie boards are not allowed in the pool. Our lifeguards need to be able to clearly see the bottom of the pool at all time and large items such as these prohibit them from doing so.

## **TRASH PICKUP INFO**



Please have trash out at the curb by 7:00 a.m. each collection day.

On each regularly scheduled collection day, Best Trash will collect residential refuse located at the curbside. Refuse must be in containers (30-50 gallons) or bags (not exceeding 40 gallons or weighing over 40 pounds).

Trees, shrubs, brush trimmings and fencing must be bundled in lengths no greater than 4 feet with no branch diameter exceeding 3 inches. The bundling is required to allow quick pickup and size limitations are required to avoid damaging the equipment in the crushing process. All residential waste materials except tree and yard waste must be either in containers, bags or bundles not exceeding 40 pounds.

Items such as appliances, furniture, carpet (up to 1 room, rolled up four feet wide and less than fifty pounds), cardboard boxes (flattened), will be picked up either day. By Federal Law, refrigerators and freezers or any other items containing Freon must be drained of Freon and have an accompanying bill to validate such service was performed.

Items excluded from normal collection are dirt, rocks, bricks, concrete, tires, batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, waste generated by a private contractor or any materials or items deemed hazardous materials. Best Trash will leave a tag explaining the reason for non-collected item(s).

An enhanced feature of the new provider will allow for items excluded by the contract if notified in advance, Best Trash will meet with a resident prior to collection day to determine a price to haul the non-contract items. If a resident does not notify Best Trash of such a special pick-up before its scheduled day, then Best Trash will leave a notice for the resident to contact Contractor during normal office hours before the next scheduled pick up day.

Please do not dispose of gasoline, motor oil, paints, cooking oil, or any other liquid items in a container that is not visible to Contractor personnel. If it results in spillage, that causes a stain, Best Trash is not responsible for the cleanup.

### Holidays

When regular pick-up falls on a holiday, New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th – Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day, the pick-up will be made on the next regularly scheduled collection day.
