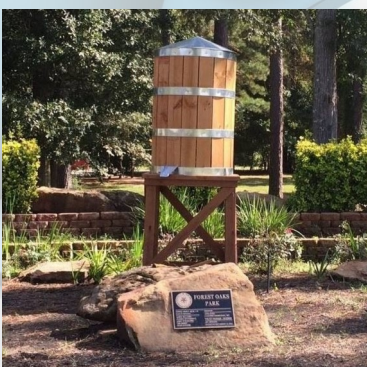

The park has remained open through the entire pandemic and has definitely been a great place for families to get out of the house for some fresh air and exercise. The pool and gym have been open with only minor adjustments and tennis has been pretty popular. Fall tennis leagues **WILL** be allowed to continue in the upcoming Fall season and teams are already starting to prepare.

You may have noticed that we have an additional 22/24 acres of park space added to the current 34 acre park. The area includes the 17 acre lake in the middle. We have stocked the new lake with tilapia, but it is still way to new for fishing to be any good yet. We will be stocking the lake with bass, bluegill and channel cats this coming Spring. We have cut some new wooded trails on the creek side of the new park area for walking and biking and will be adding a couple docks to the lake, benches and a pavilion or two in the coming future.

The park nature walk (Treys Creek) area is finally completed again since the tax day AND Harvey flood and damages. There is a new pergola, picnic pad, water feature and we also replaced the 14 year old bridge crossing the nature walk outflow since it was starting to show some wear and tear and possible safety concerns. Now the small bridge matches the big park bridge that was just rebuilt last year. **GREAT** place for family photos or a small wedding!

Hang in there WCID110, 2020 will be in the books and a park of HISTORY very soon. 2021 is now **OBLIGATED** to be a much better New Year!!!

ALL visitors are limited to ONLY 3 fishing rods/poles PER PERSON in Forest Oaks Park
A limit of ONLY 2 rods/poles per person are allowed on the main fishing dock

CATCH & RELEASE ONLY FOR ALL OUT-OF-DISTRICT VISITORS

ID Checks are **REQUIRED** when requested by **STAFF** or **CONSTABLES**
(Inspection of ALL coolers, buckets, & stringers is **REQUIRED** when requested by **STAFF** or **CONSTABLES**)

Any other fish NOT mentioned MAY be kept (carp, drum, gar, tilapia)

CAST NETS, SEINE NETS, JUG LINES, TROT LINES, STRING LINES ARE PROHIBITED

(FISHING LICENSE IS NOT REQUIRED IN FOREST OAKS PARK UNLESS FISHING IN CYPRESS CREEK)

FLOOD MITIGATION UPDATE

IN COOPERATION WITH FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL ENTITIES, ACTIONS CONTINUE TO BE TAKEN TO MITIGATE FLOODING IN THE CYPRESS CREEK WATERSHED AND HC WCID 110. FLOOD MITIGATION CONTINUES TO BE A TOP PRIORITY FOR HARRIS COUNTY WCID 110. Your HC 110 Directors, Langford Engineers ("LEI"), and Harris County Flood Control District ("HCFCD") are diligently working to reduce flooding within HC 110 and the Cypress Creek Watershed. HC 110 continues with its two-prong approach: (1) steps that can be taken **now** to immediately reduce the risk of flooding; and (2) steps to facilitate long-term projects for additional flood abatement infrastructure. Your Directors have committed funds and have authorized HC 110 to partner with HCFCD, the United States Corp of Engineers ("USACE"), and the Texas Department of Transportation ("TxDOT") on various projects.

Haas Detention Pond - HC 110 and HCFCD have partnered to excavate, enlarge, and improve the current detention pond located behind the Fred Haas dealerships, which will provide additional volume to facilitate drainage and mitigate flooding. LEI is finalizing the construction plans and will submit to HCFCD for approval once an agreement is produced, with construction scheduled to begin Fall 2020.

Enchanted Stream - HC 110 and LEI are currently working with CenterPoint and AT&T to relocate existing utilities along Enchanted Stream, just south of Cypresswood. CenterPoint and AT&T have agreed to these relocations and are working with LEI on finalizing designs and determining preliminary cost estimates to relocate existing power poles and communication lines. Relocation is expected to begin in Fall 2020. After existing utilities have been relocated, detention pond(s) can be constructed to divert some of the flood waters flowing into Senger Gully. It is anticipated that, after the utilities have been relocated, HC 110 will partner with HCFCD on the detention pond projects.

I-45 at Cypress Creek - In cooperation with HCFCD and TxDOT, drainage issues at I-45 and Cypress Creek are being addressed. TxDOT has scheduled improvements of the southbound frontage road bridge for Summer 2021. This project, upon completion, is anticipated to further mitigate flooding in this area and along Cypress Creek.

USACE - In July 2019, four (4) Letters of Intent were provided to USACE by which HC 110 requested that the USACE conduct an investigation to determine an effective flood reduction project which could be completed within the boundaries of HC 110, and pledged up to \$200,000 to match funds provided by USACE. In October 2019, John Davis with LEI and representatives of USACE met onsite at the District to determine the scope of a study of the Cypress Creek Watershed and the District. At this time, HC 110 is still awaiting a response from the USACE.

Other Projects - Several other flood mitigation projects are currently under construction or have been recently completed which will reduce flooding within the boundaries of HC 110. Although HC 110 was not involved in the projects, your Directors want to provide accurate information regarding the current projects. **Seals Gully** - HCFCD approved a channelization project to address slope erosion and various slope failures for Seals Gully. The work on the south side of Cypresswood Drive that proceeded downstream approximately 1900 feet, has been completed. Both east and west sides of the Gully have been repaired. Work south of Louetta Rd. and north of Cypresswood Dr. continues. **Senger Gully** - HCFCD approved a Sediment Removal from Concrete Lined Channels project, east of I-45, between Magic Oaks Dr. and E. North Hill Dr. Per HCFCD website, this project is still on-going. **Hardy Toll Road at Cypress Creek** - Harris County Toll Road Authority completed channelization work on both sides of Cypress Creek underneath the Hardy Toll Road. The project included hard edge treatment on lower sections of the stream banks, new storm drain outfalls, and removal of sediment on both sides of Cypress Creek. The improvements have lowered the low-level flows about two (2) feet. **Cypress Creek** - HCFCD issued a maintenance contract for erosion and channelization repairs of the Cypress Creek main channel from the west side of Hardy Toll Road upstream approximately 4,000 feet. This project includes hard edge treatment on lower sections of stream banks, replacement of storm drain outfalls, correcting flowline issues, and removal of sedimentation on both side of Cypress Creek. Construction began in September 2019 and is anticipated to be complete end of 2020.

I-45 at Cypress Creek - On July 16, the District hosted a Virtual Town Hall meeting with Congressman Crenshaw, HCFCD, and TxDOT. On July 29, John Davis, Maria Parker, and Deidra Daniels met with TxDOT and HCFCD. **On July 30, TxDOT began the process of clearing vegetation and trash debris from the underpass.** A large amount of vegetation and debris has been removed. Below are BEFORE and AFTER pictures showing the completed clearing. TxDOT has also advised that, when the I-45 southbound feeder is rebuilt (summer 2021), the design will take into consideration the dam/blocking effect that is currently occurring at the underpass. HC 110 has learned that the dam/blocking issue is caused (at least in part) by the erosion of Cypress Creek West of I-45. The erosion has significantly widened Cypress Creek. The I-45 southbound feeder rebuild, upon completion, is anticipated to further mitigate flooding in this area and along Cypress Creek.

Where My Water Bill Payments Go

As the cost of water continues to rise, we thought it would be helpful to show *residential only* customers where your payment goes.

If you were to use 10,000 gallons of water, your total bill would be **\$86.20**. Of that total:

- **\$49.20** is the fee charged by and paid to the North Harris County Regional Water Authority (NHCRA). The fee is currently \$4.92 / 1,000 gallons.
- **\$12.00** is the water fee charged by Harris County W.C.I.D. No. 110 (There is a flat fee of \$11.00 / 8,000 gallons used, and a variable fee per thousand gallons is charged over 8,000 gallons of use.)
- **\$10.07** is the flat sewer fee charged by Harris County W.C.I.D. No. 110
- **\$14.93** is the garbage collection / recycling fee paid to Best Trash (this fee is included with the sewer fee on your bill)

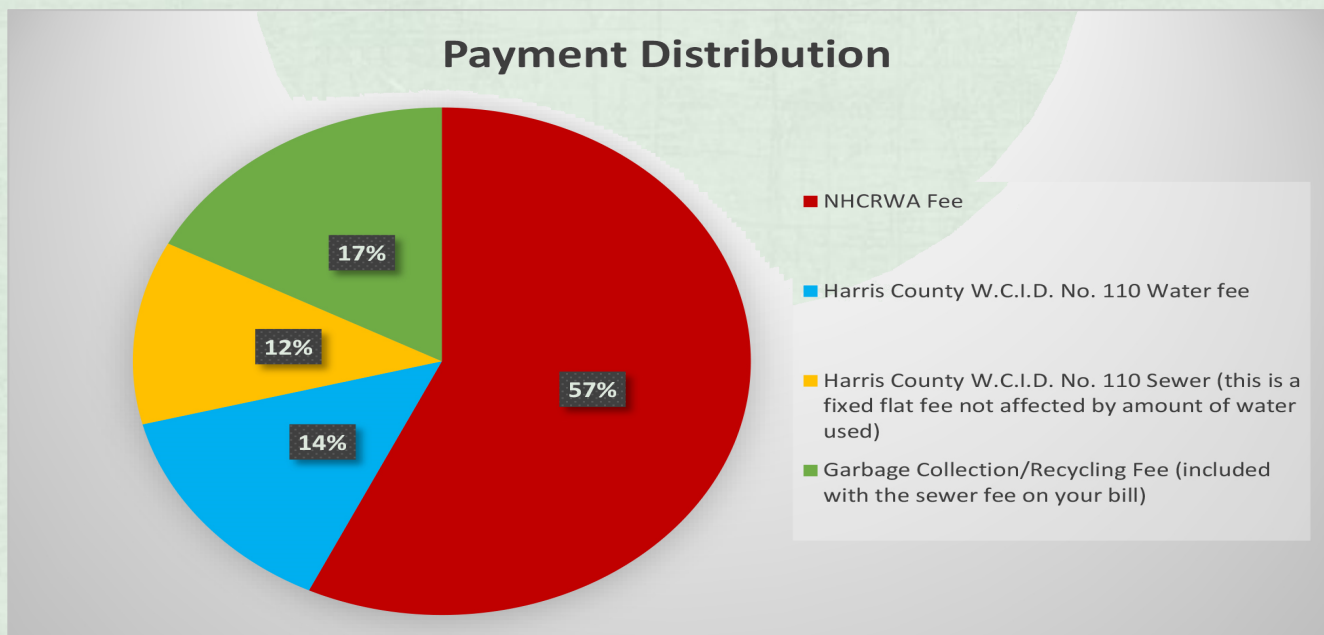


Chart based on 10,000 gallons of water used at residential rates. Percentages shown will vary based on actual use.

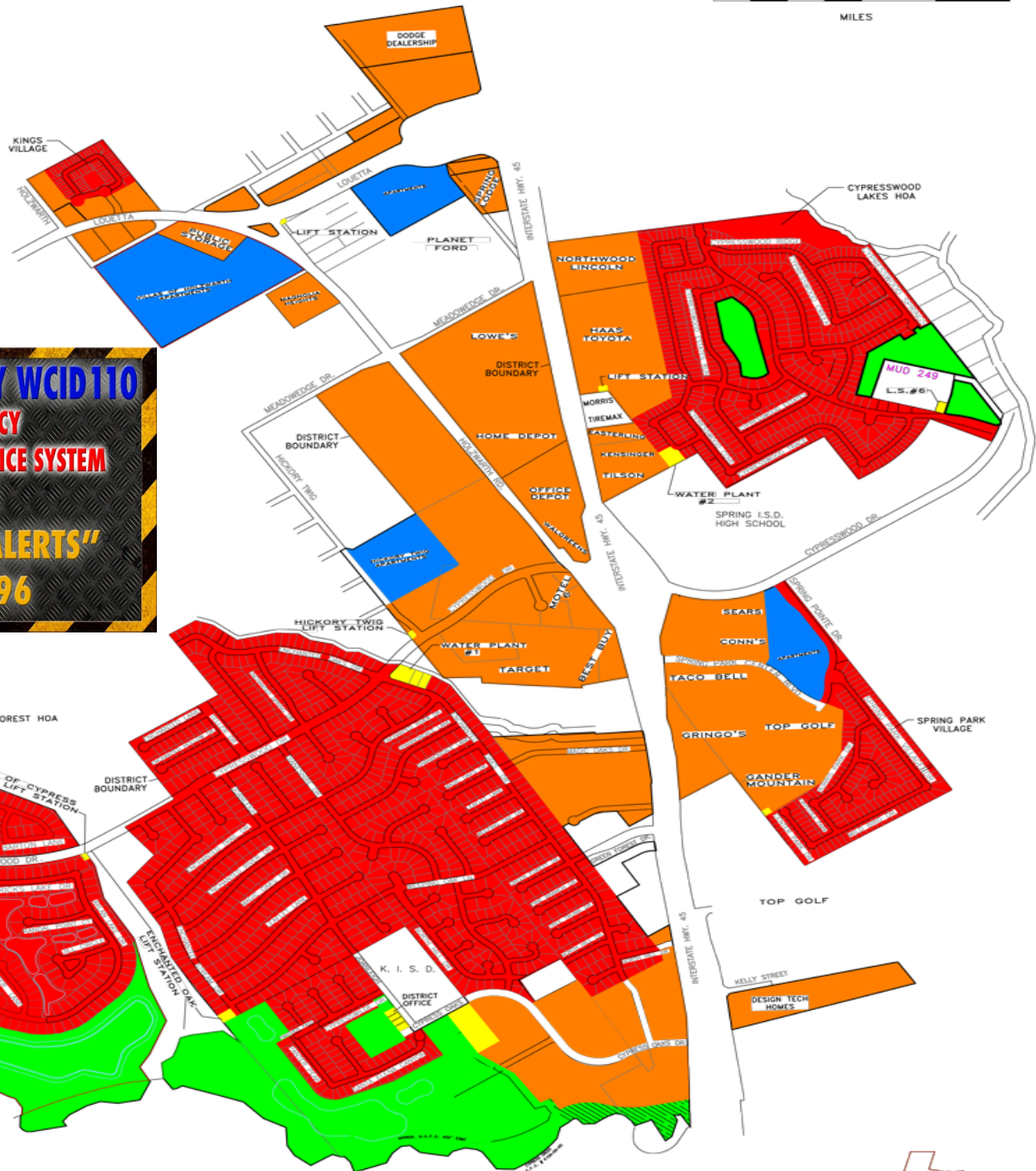

TRASH PICKUP INFO



Please have trash out at the curb by 7:00 a.m. each collection day.

On each regularly scheduled collection day, Best Trash will collect residential refuse located at the curbside. Refuse must be in containers (30-50 gallons) or bags (not exceeding 40 gallons or weighing over 40 pounds).

Trees, shrubs, brush trimmings and fencing must be bundled in lengths no greater than 4 feet with no branch diameter exceeding 3 inches. The bundling is required to allow quick pickup and size limitations are required to avoid damaging the equipment in the crushing process. All residential waste materials except tree and yard waste must be either in containers, bags or bundles not exceeding 40 pounds.

Items such as appliances, furniture, carpet (up to 1 room, rolled up four feet wide and less than fifty pounds), cardboard boxes (flattened), will be picked up either day. By Federal Law, refrigerators and freezers or any other items containing Freon must be drained of Freon and have an accompanying bill to validate such service was performed.

Items excluded from normal collection are dirt, rocks, bricks, concrete, tires, batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, waste generated by a private contractor or any materials or items deemed hazardous materials. Best Trash will leave a tag explaining the reason for non-collected item(s).

An enhanced feature of the new provider will allow for items excluded by the contract if notified in advance, Best Trash will meet with a resident prior to collection day to determine a price to haul the non-contract items. If a resident does not notify Best Trash of such a special pick-up before its scheduled day, then Best Trash will leave a notice for the resident to contact Contractor during normal office hours before the next scheduled pick up day.

Please do not dispose of gasoline, motor oil, paints, cooking oil, or any other liquid items in a container that is not visible to Contractor personnel. If it results in spillage, that causes a stain, Best Trash is not responsible for the cleanup.

Holidays

When regular pick-up falls on a holiday, New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th – Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day, the pick-up will be made on the next regularly scheduled collection day.

HEARING GUNSHOTS ON CYPRESS CREEK OR BONDS GULLY??

CALL CONSTABLES IMMEDIATELY: 281-376-3472

There have been several reports of gunshots along Cypress Creek and Bonds Gully over the last month or so. WCID110 Parks Staff called Constables a couple weeks ago on 6 people across the creek from the park shooting. P4 Deputies and the Game Warden were able to catch and cite them and the Game Warden confiscated the handguns.

Since then, there have been additional reports and calls to the WCID110 office about shots being fired. PLEASE, PLEASE call the Constables office FIRST! If the shots are in or around the park, then please follow-up with a call to the WCID110 office.

In addition to our contract deputies and our extra-duty park deputies, Precinct 4 has also assigned ATV deputies in WCID110 to randomly patrol the creek and gully from I-45 to Mirror Lake and at random times and areas. You will be seeing them in the park and along Enchanted Stream and over past Devonshire for the foreseeable future.

Due to the gunshots being heard on Cypress Creek and Bonds Gully, we have also given Park access to the Game Warden.

The Game Warden will also keep an eye on our deer feeders and deer plot area in back of the park and has been given a copy of the parks fishing policy and may from time to time ensure park fishing policy is being observed along with checking anyone fishing on Cypress Creek for fishing licences.

Normally they are in a marked vehicle, but also like to come in blacked out and unseen to catch people breaking the law. Their main concern is the gunshots on the creek and gully, but by law have to address other concerns when they catch them.

Guidelines for Pickup

- **ONLY USE CLEAR BAGS or RECYCLING CONTAINERS.** Items in black or white trash bags will not be picked up
- Have items out by 7AM
- Place recycling on opposite side of driveway from trash
- If you move, please leave the recycling container at the home

- **Paper** – magazines, newspapers, copy paper, phone books, junk mail, etc.
- **Plastic #1 through #7 (NO Styrofoam)**– juice, water, milk, soda, detergent, cleaners, RX bottles. (If in doubt, check bottom of container for recycling emblem and number in center)
- **Aluminum** – any type of soda beer or drink can, etc. **(PLEASE RINSE OUT)**
- **Tin Cans** - any food can, pet food can, etc. (no aerosol containers) **(PLEASE RINSE OUT)**
- **Cardboard** – boxes, cereal, food, detergent, pet food, etc. (No grease stained boxes or containers with food)
- **Glass** – any color glass. Must be pure glass. Cannot be ceramic, mirror, pottery stoneware, or china type items.
- **Thin Plastics** – bags from grocery, sleeve on newspaper, wrapping on dry cleaning – bags **MUST** be tied together and put into another bag. **NO LOOSE BAGS.**

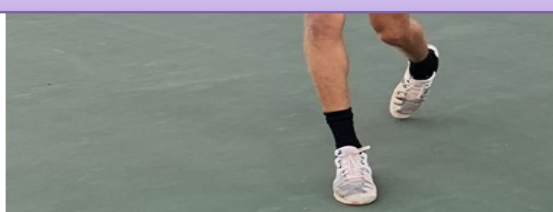

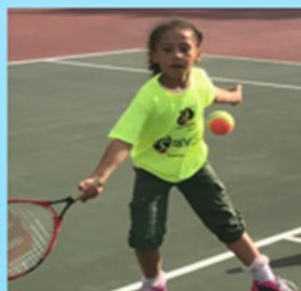
